More about Specialist Contemporary Drama

The College's NIDA trained teaching staff offer a unique program for students who are gifted and talented in performance arts.

Students entering the program in Year 7 undertake a Drama major, allowing them to access 50% more Drama tuition than other students. The program's performance focus sees students attend an annual week-long Drama camp and participate in a Drama Showcase, where Drama students perform for over two thousand primary school students.

The pathways to upper school include both General and ATAR options. Belmont City College boasts a history of exceptional Year 12 ATAR scores in Drama, that is a direct result of the success of its lower school Contemporary program. Upper school students with a true passion for theatre and acting are also invited to participate in our co curricular class, the 'Master Class', and are also selected as Drama Leaders for our annual camp. Belmont City College is currently accepting applications for primary school students to access the Primary School Drama Program in Term 2, and the Specialist Contemporary Drama program that runs in Terms 3 and 4.

Students interested in joining the program are required to complete the corresponding specialist program application form and may be asked to participate in a group workshop audition.
